Letter from the Manager

As February ends hopefully the snow and cold will be going away, and we will look forward to the pool opening and the camp activities starting.

As a reminder about the change in the golf cart policy of the coming year, the new rule that was approved at the last meeting, Rule 8d now reads: All golf carts on the premises of SRCA must have a current golf cart registration sticker(s) by Memorial Day of the current calendar year. Failure to comply will result in a \$100 fine plus the cost of the golf cart registration sticker. Also, all golf carts must be driven to the office for a quick inspection before a golf cart sticker can be handed out. We have golf cart stickers in stock. Shortly with will have all the reflective numbers and letters in stock as well in case you need them for your trailer.

We are excited about the roll out of the new electronic message board and the flexibility and up to date information that it will provide. Initially there will be two locations and a QR code that is currently on the calendar of events can be downloaded to your phone so that you will have the information at your fingertips.

All members' dues were due at the end of December. As of the January late fees of \$25.00 per month will be applied. On April 1, 2026, if the dues and or late fees are still unpaid the members key fobs will be deactivated. And finally, as of the August board meeting, if dues or fees remain unpaid the membership will be forfeited.

Dirty trailers need to be cleaned, grass needs cut, lots need cleaned, and tarps on trailers need to be removed by May 15, 2026, if not warning letters will be issued and then after two weeks fees will begin to accumulate.

The office staff, maintenance, and security are working hard this winter season to make your members' experience at the campground this coming season an enjoyable one.




Nominating/Election Committee

On Sunday, February 22, 2026, President Jim McClintock sent out an email blast to the membership announcing the resignations of two Board of Directors - Keith Critchlow (A Section) and Mike Harris (C Section). Both resignations were effective immediately.



The Special Elections for both A and C Sections are underway. Every Election packet includes the Guidelines, the Letters of Intent (one for each section) and the Observer form. The guidelines list the criteria to be a candidate and also instructions on submitting the letter of intent and campaigning.

The dates for this Section election are:

- Letters of Intent must be submitted by Thursday, March 12
- The Nominating/Election committee will qualify the candidates on March 14.
- The Ballots will be mailed to A and C Section on March 21. *For those that have a secondary address set up, the ballots will be mailed to your winter address.*
- Your ballot must be received at the Slippery Rock Post Office by Thursday, April 16.

For your convenience, at the end of this newsletter you will find the Election Guidelines, a Letter of Intent for A section and a Letter of Intent for C section and an Observer form. The Guidelines and the Observer form are the same for either Section.

As of Tuesday, February 24, you can also get paper copies in the office OR you can go to our home page at srcahome.com and scroll down to the Message Board for a link to the documents.

One last item, is your address up to date? If not, or if you are not sure, please call the office. Every year, we get a handful of mailings returned to the campground due to undeliverable mail.

SPECIAL ELECTION GUIDELINES FOR A BOARD of DIRECTOR

SECTION VACANCY

This Election packet contains the Election Guidelines for a Vacancy, Letter of Intent and Observer Form.

To qualify for a candidate for Board of Directors, a member must meet the following criteria:

1. Candidate's name must be on the Certificate of Membership for the section in which he/she is a candidate.
2. Candidate must be a member at least one year prior to **April 18, 2026**.
3. Candidate must be current on Annual Membership dues and all other fines and assessments.
4. Candidate must pass a criminal background check conducted by the Office.
5. Candidate must provide the Office with a current, clear Child Abuse History Certification. (*certifications are current if within 60 months from the date of the clearance*).
6. Candidate cannot be a paid employee of the Association.
7. Candidate shall not be the spouse of, or a co-owner of any membership(s) owned by a current Director.
8. Candidate with a Major Offense of the campground rules within the past 3-years is ineligible for candidacy.
9. Candidate CANNOT interfere with the Nominating/Election Committee rules regarding the election process. Any violation will render the candidate disqualified. The candidate will be notified of the reason(s) for this disqualification.
10. Active participation on Association committees is encouraged.

TO SUBMIT A LETTER OF INTENT (LOI): All qualified candidates who submit a LOI will have their names appear on the ballot. A signed and dated LOI must be in possession of the Office by end of business day **Thursday, March 12, 2026**. Candidate's qualifications will be verified by the Nomination & Election Committee on **Saturday, March 14, 2026**.

CANDIDATE'S ANNOUNCEMENT: All qualified candidates will be posted on the SRCA website and on all outlying bulletin boards. Candidate's *Letter of Intent* and *Letter of Introduction* will be posted on the SRCA website and on all outlying bulletin boards. Personal information will be redacted before posting.

***** Campaigning can begin after *Letters of Intent* are posted *****

CAMPAIGN SIGNS shall not exceed 18" X 24" in size. If your signs exceed the required measurements, you will be asked to adjust them or remove them. **One (1) sign is permitted per lot per candidate, endorsing the candidate only**. Campaign signs are not permitted on any Association lots, common grounds, or bulletin boards. Do not staple or nail to any tree. Campaign signs may be placed on other member's lots with the permission of that member. All campaign signs must be removed by the day after the election.

OBSERVERS: Each candidate is permitted one (1) observer. The observer must be a member of the campground. The candidate should review the instructions on the Observer Form with their designated Observer. The candidate must submit their Observer's Form to the Office no later than **Thurs., April 16, 2026**.

TIE: A tie in the election of a section director will be decided by a coin toss. A 3-way tie will be decided by high card draw using one suit of a deck of playing cards, with the Ace removed. The Nominating and Election Chairperson or a Board officer will conduct the tie breaker the day the ballots are counted in the Rec Hall. Order of toss or draw is determined by first letter of last name.

Moving From Gratitude to Groundedness: The Power of Boundaries

As we transition away from the holiday season—a time often defined by looking outward through gratitude and reaching out to loved ones—it is the perfect moment to turn our focus inward. While gratitude helps us appreciate the beauty in our lives, and connection keeps us anchored, true mental well-being also requires a protective element.

The next vital area to explore in our journey of cultivation is **Developing Personal Agency through Boundaries**. Think of this as the “infrastructure” of your mental health; if gratitude is the light in the room, boundaries are the walls that keep the heat from escaping.

Cultivating boundaries isn't about building a fortress to keep people out; it's about creating a sustainable ecosystem for yourself. It starts with reclaiming your most precious resources: your time and your emotional energy. By practicing the “**slow yes**”—taking space to consider a request before committing—you shift from a reactive state of people-pleasing to a proactive state of intentionality. This might mean setting a “digital sunset” to protect your peace from the 24/7 noise of the world, or simply learning to identify which interactions leave you feeling energized versus depleted.

We often fear that setting limits makes us “difficult” or unkind, but the opposite is true. Boundaries are actually an act of kindness toward our community. When we protect our energy, we prevent the resentment and burnout that often poison our relationships. By being honest about our limits, we show up more authentically for the things we do say yes to. As you move forward, remember that mental health isn't just about adding more “good” habits; it's about honoring your own space enough to let those habits flourish.

□ Your Boundary Toolkit

Three Questions for Reflection Before you commit to a new task or social engagement this week, ask yourself:

- **The Capacity Check:** Do I actually have the time and energy for this, or am I “borrowing” that energy from my sleep, health, or family?
- **The “Why” Behind the “Yes”:** Am I saying yes because I want to contribute, or because I am afraid of the discomfort of saying no?
- **The Resentment Radar:** If I do this, will I feel proud of my contribution later, or will I feel frustrated with the person who asked?

Small Wins: Two-Minute Boundaries

- **The Notification Audit:** Turn off non-human notifications (apps, news, shopping alerts) for 24 hours. Notice how much “mental noise” disappears.
- **The Rehearsal:** Practice saying this phrase out loud so it feels natural: *“I'd love to help with that, but I don't have the bandwidth to do it justice right now.”*

- **The “In-Between” Space:** Commit to five minutes of silence between finishing work and starting your evening routine. This creates a boundary between your “productive” self and your “rest” self.
